Before worship begins, have a piece of bread and a glass of wine or juice ready in the space where you are worshipping. If you are worshipping with others in your home, share the bread and cup with the words "The body of Christ given for you" and "The blood of Christ shed for you". If you are worshipping an individual connected to our larger community, hear the words of the pastor "given for you" and "shed for you" as just that, **for you**, and eat and drink in that moment. If you don't have bread or wine, consider something similar that you do have in your home. Crackers, another kind of juice? It is ok to be creative using what you have, those ordinary things in your home.


