## A Message from Pastor Mathew

<sup>10</sup> But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: <sup>11</sup> to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. (Luke 2:10-11)

The long-awaited birth of our Savior is here! I pray that in the midst of this season’s pain and struggles you have each been touched by God’s gifts of hope, peace, joy and love this Christmas. If you long to keep the tree up a little longer or to sing another carol, I have good news. The Christmas season is not yet over; there are 12 days of Christmas after all! The Christmas season lasts until Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup>.

For the past few years, I’ve been reminded of this Christmas poem written by Madeleine L’Engle, author of *A Wrinkle in Time* and other classics:

“God did not wait till the world was ready,  
till...the nations were at peace.

God came when the heavens were unsteady,  
and prisoners cried out for release.

God did not wait for the perfect time.

God came when the need was deep and great.

God dined with sinners in all their grime,  
turned water into wine. God did not wait

Till hearts were pure. In joy God came  
to a tarnished world of sin and doubt.

To a world like ours of anguished shame

God came, and God's light would not go out.

God came to a world which did not mesh,  
to heal its tangles, shield its scorn.

In the mystery of Word made Flesh  
the Maker of the stars was born.

We cannot wait til the world is sane  
to raise our songs with joyful voice,

for to share our grief, to touch our pain,

God came with Love: Rejoice! Rejoice!” (‘First Coming’ by Madeleine L’Engle)

As we look ahead to a new calendar year and dream of what will be for ourselves, our families, and our community, I pray that we will continue to allow the good news which the angels proclaimed, to shape us. The New Year is a time of hopeful expectation, but it can also be a frightening time: knowing we will enter the year without a certain loved one, wondering if the new year will be easier than the last ones.

The miracle of Christmas is that Jesus Christ has come to us precisely in our fear and worry and doubt. As this poem reminds us, God did not wait until we had everything together and our lives perfectly sorted out. God did not wait until we followed through with our resolutions. God came into our messy, grief-stricken world so that Christ could *share* in our struggles and pain, and in his presence with us there is unending love and salvation.

No matter what the New Year will bring, friends, Christ has been born to us and will be with us every step of the way. This truly is good news of great joy for all the people.
