

Pastor Wayne Sez

A Look at our Faith—The Creed



The First Article: On Creation I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. What is this? or What does this mean? I believe that God has created me together with all that exists. God has given me and still preserves my body and soul: eyes, ears, and all limbs and senses; reason and all mental faculties. In addition, God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, fields, livestock, and all property—along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life. God protects me against all danger and shields and preserves me from all evil. And all this is done out of pure fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness of mine at all! For all of this I owe it to God to thank and praise, serve, and obey him. This is most certainly true. (Martin Luther)

As adults, it is good to take a look at what we confess as Lutherans. Let's take a look at what we confess about this God who creates. Notice that Luther talks about God creating me! That means rather than arguing about how many days it took God to create the world, Luther wants to start the discussion with I believe God Created me. This means that I, Wayne Shelksohn born September 19th, 1950, Martin Luther Born November 10,1483, and {*your name, your birth date*} are now in a responsible relationship with God. Rather than entering into a debate about how God creates or how long it took God to create, God has declared that He and I are entering into a dialogue about who I am in relation to what God does and what God calls me to be and do. God makes it clear that He gives and preserves everything I am. It is this creating God who provides everything I need for life abundantly. And God is the one who protects me and preserves me from evil. Why? Simply because he loves his creation—Luther, me, you, your neighbor, your family, that person you can't stand. I diverge from Luther, but God does this out of pure fatherly and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit of worthiness of mine at all. Or as Luther liked to say, it is not that we can do little, it is that we can do nothing. What can we do? I can thank God, I can praise God, I can serve and obey God. When it comes to creation, you are the proof of a creating God. Now we come back to our faith as we are to fear, love, and trust God above everything else and we are called by Christ our lord to love each other as He has loved us.

Community Closet


