The Third Petition

Your will be done on earth as in heaven.

What is this? **OR** What does this mean?

In fact, God's good and gracious will comes about without our prayer, but we ask in this prayer that it may also come about in and among us.

How does this come about?

Whenever God breaks and hinders every evil scheme and will—as are present in the will of the devil, the world, and our flesh; that would not allow us

to hallow God's name and would prevent the coming of his kingdom, and instead whenever God strengthens us and keeps us steadfast in his word and in faith until the end of our lives. This is God's gracious and good will.

Have you noticed yet that when it comes to making God's name holy, or bringing in the kingdom, or doing God's will, it is not dependent upon our help or our prayer. "God's good and gracious will comes about without *our* prayer" but we ask that it goes to work in our lives. It goes about to break in us every **evil** scheme and will of three things. For Luther and the Lutheran confessions, Evil comes about in three forms, is known as the "Trinity of Evil", and is as indivisible as the Holy Trinity. It isn't as we often say, "The devil made me do it." Rather, it is the whole trinity of evil at work in our lives.

The Devil John 8:44 says, "when he lies, he lies he is speaking his native language, He is a liar and the father of lies." He tells us lies about who God is, he tells us lies about who we are, and he tells us lies about who our neighbor is. Through these constant lies, the devil wants us to doubt God's Good and gracious will. He also wants us to doubt who we are as God's beloved children and that we need to find ways to separate from our neighbor.

The World comes to us with a cornucopia of things and opportunities, some are good and some are bad. The world tells us that through what is offered, it is there that you will find true happiness and meaning. Just look at our advertisements that offer us this or that and or tell us that if we have them, we will be truly happy. And yet, these things never seem to deliver complete happiness or meaning. The sinful self is nothing other than the old Adam and the old Eve deep inside of us that says I want to be my own God, I want my name to be holy, I want my will done, I want my Kingdom to Come, I want my Authority to be honored, and just keep piling on the I's and the devil and the world will cheer you on.

At his point, Paul says in Romans 7:24-25, "O wretched man that I am! Who will save me from this body of death? Thank God for Jesus Christ our Lord!"

God goes to work, strengthens us and keeps us steadfast in his word and in faith until the end of our lives. This is God's gracious and good will. Have you noticed how many times His Word is mentioned in Luther's explanations? John:1 tells us that God's Word became flesh (Jesus the Christ), that his word is in the Holy scriptures, and that it is proclaimed in community as we gather Sunday after Sunday to hear God's good and gracious will for us in Jesus Christ. He invites us to find ways to be neighbors. God gives us His good a gracious will Sunday after Sunday by giving us Jesus Christ and his salvation in water and in word, and in bread and wine. We ask in this prayer that it may also come about in and among us.
