For these next few articles I want to look at the **HOLY EUCHARIST, HOLY COMMUNION, THE LORDS SUPPER.** In this article I am not going to refer to Luther's explanation of The Sacrament of The Altar. But what the reality that this sacrament or Holy meal brings to us as the Church. We are now in the long green season of the Sundays after the Pentecost. Green represents growth and this seasons calls the church to grow in our discipleship. **We though many through out the earth, we are one body in this one Lord.** This raises an interesting conundrum how do we though many with all of our differences act like one body; in this one lord. Think back how many times have you seen different opinions rase up to become a church fight. And all of a sudden your hearts start to race. Your blood rushes to your face and; your anger seems to get the better of you. Doesn't seem much like unity, and soon we grow into factions. No where throughout history has everybody agreed on everything. Disagreements are part of our reality and can be very heathy. It is not that we in the Church as people growing in our personal and corporate discipleship to **THIS ONE LORD** won't have disagreements our discipleship calls for us to find ways to disagree well. So how can we do that as we gather around this meal about community. Here are seven things to try.

- 1. Admit that we or I don't know everything, and we or I could be wrong.
- 2. Unrealistic expectation hinders good debate. Try to see the argument from the other person's point of view. Your thoughts should be shared and even defended. But can we approach every discussion with the assumption that we can learn something from the other person.
- 3. There is a need to differentiate between essentials and non-essentials what really matters here. Is it to destroy the opponent or bring resolution to a problem. And just a word of advice Social Media is probably not the best place to sort out the essentials and non-essentials.
- 4. Establish points of agreement which builds rapport and congeniality.
- 5. Use active listening state back what you have heard the other person say with respect and open mindedness.
- 6. Unchecked emotions often hamper our ability to reach resolution
- 7. Our relationship takes precedence over winning Ephesians 4:1 calls us find a solution with these words "make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace
