

### The Sixth Petition

Save us from the time of trial.

What is this? OR What does this mean?

It is true that God tempts no one, but we ask in this prayer that God would preserve and keep us, so that the devil, the world, and our flesh may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great and shameful sins, and that, although we may be attacked by them, we may finally prevail and gain the victory.

When I was a child, I would often get a picture of this petition along with the 22<sup>nd</sup> Psalm as the shepherd Jesus or God dragging some poor helpless sheep into a canyon (grew up out west) where there were all kinds of things that could hurt you. The other was a cartoon picture of a devil on one shoulder and an angel on the right shoulder battling it out and just like in the cartoon and the bad side always seemed to be more appealing. But neither of these pictures are true about this Triune God. Luther puts it simply that God does not test, tempt, or coax us or anyone else. This is tough for me because I will stay up all night cramming for a blood test. This petition is not about getting something right but about the preserving power of Gods Grace. Preserving us from the power of the trinity of Evil, (the devil, the world, the sin-full self). The sin-full self's god is ME, MYSELF AND I. The world tells us that we would be happy if we only had this that or the other, For me, if only you could pass and get an A on an blood test, but you probably haven't studied hard enough.

The world also tells us we aren't happy because we don't have this, that, or the other and there is our neighbor who seems to have them, but doesn't deserve them, therefore we can dislike them! The devil constantly whispers in our ear that we have been treated unfairly by God, the world, our neighbor, and our self. But what we truly ask for in this petition is that by grace, we may not be deceived by this trinity of evil and be led into false belief or despair. It is a false belief that it depends on me. It is a false belief that God cannot preserve and keep me just by the grace of his word and the Sacraments that name me and feed me, and walk with me through the valley of doubt despair and misbelief.

Sunday after Sunday, we are invited to hear the Good News which comes among God's people—to hear in the quiet of prayer, in the proclamation of God's word, or in the splash of water that constantly calls us by name and states we are God's children. It is the belief that in bread and wine we partake of the Body and Blood of a new covenant based not on must do, but what we get to do and be because of the Gospel of forgiveness of sin. This promise preserve us through all the trials that life and the trinity of evil can throw at us as God, his word, and his sacrament will prevail.

Though Satan rant and rage and fiercest war engage, this tyrant's doomed to fail; God's judgement must prevail! One little word shall triumph. God's word shall stand above the powers and shall end their thanksgiving. The Spirit and the gifts are ours, for God with us is living. Let good and kindred go, this mortal life also; though all of these be gone, they yet have nothing won. The kingdom's ours forever! "A Mighty Fortress is Our God"
